At the conclusion of her year in Ambassador, Fatimah negotiated with her landlord and was able to stay in the complex for a reduced rent.

Fatima is currently attending Mesa Community College to obtain her degree in Child and Family Development. Upon completion of her degree, Fatimah plans to move into a management position and continue providing the best possible home for Christopher.
